Why is this relevant to you?

You are not running the meeting, but...

- It's 20 minutes and this meeting has been about the roundness of a button
- Last meeting went about the same...
- No one is coming away with an idea of what we're doing next

This is not a good use of anyone's time!

Why am I relevant to this?

I am not a runner of meetings, but...

- I'm a "cat herder"
- I'm a backend engineer
- Worked in small (<20) and larger (>200) companies

DebuggingAre you the right voice for this?

- How new are you to this feature?
 - To this team/company?
 - Are the vibes good?
- Who is "on paper" running the meetings?
 - O Do they like feedback?
- Who is "on paper" taking notes?
 - Do they get more sway among the meeting participants?

DebuggingAre you the right voice for this?

- When was the last time you tried this?
- Basically: is there <u>opportunity</u> to take some charge?

P.S. Make sure you are not part of the problem!

Diagnostic TestingWhat tools do you have for this?

- Recruit a party! Potential allies include:
 - A(nother) senior voice
 - Project management or scrum master positions

Diagnostic TestingWhat tools do you have for this?

- 2
- Try out various positions in a meeting
 - If there is no agenda-keeper, offer to be one
 - Test out asking for action items in the last ~5-10 minutes of a meeting
 - Maybe rotate responsibilities

Diagnostic TestingWhat tools do you have for this?

- 3
- Try an interruption (if the vibes are right)!
 - Especially if you have a part of the feature you need clarifying
 - Ask permission/forgiveness from the meeting-runner

Strategy Executions Examples

 "I believe \$ally and I would also like time to bring up \$subject_that_will_move_the_conversation"

"So what is the action item you'd like me to write down?"

 "\$meeting_runner, is it okay if I suggested moving \$current_subject to its own meeting? I had a question for \$ally about \$different_subject"
